The 2010 Stand Up action on the steps of San Francisco's City Hall had a special focus on supporting and replenishing the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis & Malaria (the Global Fund). Bay Area advocates stood with blow-ups of a letter to President Obama circulated by Oakland's Congresswoman Barbara Lee that had 101 other congressional signers, and a San Francisco Chronicle editorial. Both the sign-on letter and the editorial asked the President to commit to a large increase in US support for the Global Fund.

This is a great example of collaboration between local, national and global of citizens and advocacy groups working together to demonstrate popular support for the Millennium Development Goals and creating the political will required to achieve them.

The end result of this was that at the Global Fund conference October 4th in New York, President Obama boosted the US pledge to the Global Fund by 38 percent to \$4 billion for three years. This is the biggest ever US contribution to the Global Fund, and for the first time as a three-year pledge, thereby providing the fund longer-term financial security.
