In 2010, for the fifth year in a row, tens of millions of people will Stand Up at thousands of public gathering around the world to show support for achieving the Millennium Development Goals. Last year Stand Up events in the San Francisco Bay Area joined with 173 million people at over 3,000 locations in 120 countries, counted and verified by the Guinness Book of Worlds Records.

In 2000 our government signed the Millennium Declaration, agreeing to share responsibility, take action and meet eight goals to end poverty and its root causes. 2010 is our year to access progress and take action leading up to a 2010 MDG Review Summit on September 20th – 23rd at the UN General Assembly in New York, the most important global policy event of the year.

The UN Millennium Campaign organizes popular support for achieving the eight Millennium Development Goals, the global consensus plan, endorsed by 189 governments in 2000 to reduce extreme poverty by half by the year 2015. One of the key goals is to fight HIV/AIDS, Malaria and TB. Another goal is to provide universal access to clean safe drinking water.
